

WHAT IS THE MOBILITY PROGRAMME?


European schools – official and accredited – offer the possibility of hosting as well as sending pupils to other European schools – official and accredited – during the first semester of **S5**.

Those stays can take place as (1) Real exchanges (visit and return visit) or as (2) One-way visits (family not hosting in return).

(1) Real exchange: Your family hosts a pupil and your child is hosted by the pupil's family (or possibly another).










Maximises your chances!

(2) One-way visit: Your child is hosted by a family abroad, but you don't host a pupil in return.



You can also volunteer to be a host family!

AIMS



This programme was created to give students the opportunity go to another European school for a short period (maximum 1 semester) in their L1 section.

One of the goals is to allow students to pursue their home school's curriculum abroad and stay with a host family who speaks their LII, LIII or LIV.

All S4 students are eligible to apply to participate in the Mobility programme. The stay takes place within the first semester of S5, during the school year 2023-2024 (**Sept-Dec**).

The goal is both <u>linguistic</u>(improve LII, LIII or LIV) and <u>cultural</u>. Adaptation to a different educational and cultural context and to the host family requires a certain maturity.

Pupils may choose two European schools, according to their linguistic, cultural and personal goals.



WHAT IS THE PROCEDURE?

The curriculum followed at EEB3 and the one of the host school should be the same.

Students from less common language sections may attend as SWALS.

2. Complete the **Application Form** (1 page).



Most schools only accept stays of 1 full semester (September - December)

3. Attached to the Application form, a <u>cover letter</u> (lettre de motivation) written by the S4 student explaining why he/she wishes to participate in the Mobility programme (1 page).

Mobility Programme from and to European Schools

Maximum duration: 4 months - from September until December

Since the sanitary and public health situation differs among Member States and is constantly evolving, the Mobility programme can only be implemented on condition that national or local health regulations and travel restrictions are respected.

This application form must be submitted no later than December 14, 2022.

Once both European schools have approved the exchange (by March 2023), families should contact the Parents' Association of the host school to find a host family.

SELECTION CRITERIA



- o School records,
- Maturity,
- Motivation,
- Educational project,
- o Availability at the chosen school.

The selection is made by the coordinator and the Educational adviser of S4.

The list of selected applicants will be discussed during the class council.





If your child's application has been selected, the school coordinator contacts the targeted European schools to set up the exchange (if possible).

Various annexes to be completed (2->9), as from February/March 2023.

A FEW FACTS

There is a limited number of places in the schools!

We try, as much as possible, to send and receive a similar number of pupils per language section (for class size and capacity reasons) and per school.

CONSEQUENCES WHEN BACK TO EEB3



In case a subject is not offered in the host school, the pupil takes responsibility for catching up with the subjects seen during his/her absence so as not to fall behind when back to EEB3.

Exams: The grades from the host school are recorded in the report upon return at EEB3.

If an Exam/B-Test should have been taken in December at EEB3 but was not taken at the host school (because the course was not offered), the grades for the second semester at EEB3 will be doubled and will count for the entire school year.

COSTS



School fees for the exchange period are paid to the home school.

The host school and family should not charge you for your stay, but this should be discussed with the Parents Association of the host school.

You could be invoiced for additional expenses such as school trips, organised by the host school, if agreed in advance.



Host schools are not required to make any extra costs for guest students (i.e. Learning support).



HOW TO FIND A HOST FAMILY?

Once you have received confirmation of placement in a school (by March), they will let you know how to go about finding a host family – usually through contacting the host school's Parents Association.

If you know of a local family who could host your child, you can also contact them.

The school coordinators and the Parents Association contact person have different roles!

The APEEE of the host school is responsible for practical (and essential) details regarding

host families and **school's services** (transport, canteen, second-hand books, extracurricular activities, ...).

The hosting school's APEE facilitates finding the host family, if not organized by the sending family itself.



EXPERIENCE FROM LAST YEAR

Last school year (2021-22), 100 applicants in total.

We have <u>sent</u> 20 pupils and <u>hosted</u> 20 pupils (40 in total) to and from the following European schools: Varese, Alicante, The Hague, Parma, Frankfurt, Munich, Tallinn, Heraklion, Bergen and Helsinki.

Please note that the final decision lies with the host schools.

This means that **even if our school has selected your child's application** to participate in the programme, **it is possible that the target host schools may not be able to accept the application**. In this case, mobility cannot take place. Also, if no host family has been found, mobility cannot not take place.

For organizational reasons, we privilege <u>mutual</u> (visit and return visit) and <u>simultaneous exchanges</u> of a whole semester (from September to December 2023).

The European schools implement the exchanges, but there are many actors involved in this programme: in addition to the coordinator of the home and host schools, you will get in touch with the APEE contacts of the home and host schools, teachers, pupils and their family and of course we count on the full collaboration of the parents to set up together the practical aspects of the mobility.
